Will you please send me any information that you may have in regard to the following Revolutionary war soldiers:

1 - Richard Simms, who was on the Missouri pension roll, 1833, for services under Captain Wm. Washington and Col. Mercer, 3rd Virginia Regiment. Born in Virginia in 1752 and died in Clay county Missouri in 1850. Married Betty Ashby.

2 - Solomon Bishop, who enlisted under Cap. Morgan Alexander for one year, and under Cap. Marquist Calmes for 3 years. Received land warrant, 100 acres, under discharge, Richmond, Virginia. Resident of Frederick county, Virginia. Cert. pension issued November 8, 1832, Nelson county, Kentucky.

in 1776, served as private in Captain William Washington's Company, Colonels Mercer, Weedon and Marshall's Third Virginia Regiment, was in the battles of New York and Brandywine, and was discharged at the expiration of service of two years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed August 29, 1816, while a resident of Scott County, Kentucky, and stated that he was aged fifty-eight years.

In 1833 he was living in Clay County, Missouri, and stated then that he was aged seventy-five years.

There are no data in the original papers on file as to family.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the records of Solomon Bishop and Richard Simms, Revolutionary War soldiers.

Their records are furnished you herewith as found in the claims for pension based upon service in the Revolutionary War.

Solomon Bishop, S. 3063

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of Solomon Bishop are not stated.

While a resident of Frederick County, Virginia, Solomon Bishop enlisted in 1775 and served one year as private in Captain Morgan Alexander's Company in the Second Virginia Regiment. He then reenlisted, served as private in Captain Marquis Calmes' Company, Colonel Spotswood's Second Virginia Regiment, was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Monmouth and served three years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed July 25, 1823 at which time he was seventy-seven years old and a resident of Nelson County, Kentucky.

Date of death not on file.

It is shown that he received one hundred acres of land from the State of Virginia on account of his service in the Revolutionary War.

There are no family data.

Richard Simms enlisted in Virginia, place not stated.

 Ashland County } Subscriber a Justice of the Peace in and
 -dent City of said County } for said County Solomon Bishop a dis-
 -ident Citizen of said County who being duly sworn according to law
 that on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain
 the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of Congress passed June
 the 17th 1832 - to wit that he is now seventy seven years of age
 that he enlisted in the year 1795 under Capt Morgan Alexander
 of the 2nd Batt State Regiment for the period of one year and
 faithfully served his time out when he again recruited in the
 same Regiment and under Capt Elmer's Company formerly
 Capt under Capt Alexander for the term of three years
 and faithfully served out his term of enlistment when he was
 honorably discharged that his discharge was sent to Newmarket
 Virginia where he received a land warrant for one hundred
 acres of land for said service - he says that his residence was
 in Frederick County Virginia that Col Spotswood Cannon
 was in the Battle of Brandywine Green Tavern and Chancellors
 He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Divisor or annuity
 except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pen-
 sion roll of any Agency in any State and further that he is ab-
 -solutely incompetent having lost by a Paralytic Stroke one half or
 one side of him that he is unable to make his Declaration in
 open Court and further he saith not
 sworn and subscribed before me } his
