Died of Typhoid.

Lexington, Ky., Sept. 5.—[Special.]—James H. Tingle, an attorney of the Lexington bar, died this morning of typhoid fever at the home of his parents, 372 East Third street. Mr. Tingle graduated from the law department of Kentucky University last June, and had practiced his profession only a few months when he was taken ill. Mr. Tingle was twenty-three years old and was a son of William Tingle, of this city. He is survived by his parents and his sister, Miss Virginia Tingle. The funeral will be held to-morrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at the family residence, the Rev. W. P. Hines, of Calvary Baptist church, officiating.
