

VERNON TINGLE DIES SATURDAY

Succumbs Hour after Being Admitted to Hospital.

Vernon Tingle, 61, of 523 Webmeier street, died at 10 o'clock
Saturday night at the county hospital, about an hour after being
admitted there.
City firemen were called to the
Tingle home to give emergency aid
but attempts to revive the stricken
man with oxygen failed.
A native of Trimble county Ky,
he was born Feb. 7, 1896, to David
and Charlotte Beck Tingle. He belonged to the Baptist church.
Funeral services will be held at
1:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at
Hathaway funeral home, conducted by the Rev. Claude Fulks and
the Rev. Robert Forester. Burial
will be made at Garland Brook
cemetery. Casket is open at the
funeral home.
Survivors are the wife, Mrs. Anna
Tingle; five daughters, Mrs. Joseph
Sacheban, with whom the Tingles
made their home, Mrs. Leroy
Hunteman of Indianapelis,
George Huffington of Lexington,
Mrs. Dale Hunsucker of Columbus
and Mrs. Robert Ponsier of Jacksonville, Fla.; a son, Clarence Tingle of Columbus; two sisters, Mrs.
Charles Monroe, and Mrs. Jesse
Campbell, both of Madison; three
brothers, Lester Tingle and Raymond Tingle, both of Madison, and
Stanley Tingle of Versailles; and
12 grandchildren. Three brothers
preceded him in death, one in January and one in April of this year.
